1. **MR. D. SALESHANDO, MP. (MAUN NORTH):** To ask the Minister for State President to state the number of Commissions of Enquiry that have been undertaken since independence. How many of the reports were released to the public and whether or not Government will consider releasing the reports that were never made public. (1)
2. **MR. G. KEKGONEGILE, MP. (MAUN EAST):** To ask the Minister of Transport and Infrastructure to update this Honourable House on the progress made in compensating individuals relocated to give way for the Maun International Airport expansion, in particular: (2)
 - (i) total number of individuals to be compensated, number compensated and those not compensated; and
 - (ii) reasons for none payment, mitigating factors, payment plans and actual payment date on pending payments.
3. **MR. T. B. LUCAS, MP. (BOBIRWA):** To ask the Minister of Trade and Entrepreneurship to give an update on the Mathathane-Plaatjan road; the Minister should state: (3)
 - (i) the amount of money available for the road;
 - (ii) where the money comes from;
 - (iii) the procurement protocols and processes followed to date;
 - (iv) the possible commencement date for the construction of the road;
 - (v) the engagements with European Union as a development partner on the project; and
 - (vi) the reasons for the delay of the commencement of the project.

4. **MR. M. MOALOSI, MP. (NKANGE):** To ask the Minister of Lands and Agriculture: (4)
- (i) to confirm whether farmers in Bobirwa who lost their cattle due to cross border cattle rustling were compensated by the Government;
 - (ii) if *mephato* in Bobirwa are being paid through Ipelegeng to help patrol the area to curb stock theft;
 - (iii) why has this compensation programme not been extended to the people of Tutume District particularly in Maitengwe and Sepako;
 - (iv) if he does not see the need to treat all Batswana equally and apply similar compensation measures to all similarly affected farmers; and
 - (v) what is the new Government's long-term plan to help farmers to better secure their livestock from cattle rustlers.
5. **DR. K. GOBOTSWANG, MP. (TSWAPONG SOUTH):** To ask the Minister of Local Government and Traditional Affairs to apprise this Honourable House on the Mmaseteba landfill in Mmathubudukwane; he should specifically state: (5)
- (i) if Kgatleng District Council has land rights to use the place as a landfill or dumping site;
 - (ii) the impact of the landfill on the environment especially human health, animal health and underground water; and
 - (iii) remedies in place to address the problem in the short, medium and long term.
6. **MR. T. FURNITURE, MP. (TATI EAST):** To ask the Minister of Local Government and Traditional Affairs: (6)
- (i) what the Rural Area Development Programme (RADP) entails;
 - (ii) what are Government's intentions regarding this programme;
 - (iii) when will the programme end; and
 - (iv) how often are officers in those designated remote settlements assisted with transport.

7. **MR. A. K. KHAN, MP. (MOLEPOLOLE NORTH):** To ask the Minister of Trade and Entrepreneurship: (7)
- (i) how much the Citizen Entrepreneurial Development Agency (CEDA) has spent in remunerating both the caretaker Chief Executive Officer (CEO) and the suspended CEO since the suspension took effect; and
 - (ii) would it not have been more prudent for Government or the CEDA Board to appoint the Deputy CEO to act until the matter is resolved, in order to avoid unnecessary duplication of costs.
8. **MR. K. NKAWANA, MP. (SELEBI PHIKWE EAST):** To ask the Minister of Environment and Tourism to state: (8)
- (i) whether it is cost effective for the Department of Wildlife and National Parks personnel to shuttle between protected areas and the main station every 3 months for duty/off duty days;
 - (ii) the status of the game domestication project at Dithopho Game Ranch;
 - (iii) the good or bad lessons Government has learnt; and
 - (iv) if the Minister would give a detailed financial expenditure since the inception of the project to date.
9. **MR. M. M. PULE, MP. (KGATLENG EAST):** To ask the Minister of Transport and Infrastructure to provide an update on the progress of the Modipane-Mabalane Road project, currently under construction using the Development Manager Model and to specifically: (9)
- (i) share details on the current status of construction milestones achieved;
 - (ii) indicate if there are any encountered or anticipated delays; and
 - (iii) state the estimated timeframe for the project's completion.
